The conclusions of the survey set many thinking, but ultimately it was WZO that decided to take up the challenge to rehabilitate these poor Zoroastrian families. WZO London, whose committee I was on, encouraged

have been leading a small team, all the members of which have been truly dynamic, committed to the causes espoused and adequately dedicated to bring about qualitative changes in the lives of underprivileged members of our Community.

I recall with clarity how and when my life began to change. It was in the later part of nineteen eighties that a sample socio economic survey conducted in

me to form a Trust in India and take up the challenge of rehabilitating these impoverished Zoroastrian families, most of who were farmers.

It was a stroke of great fortune for the Community in general and me in particular, that two outstanding and very sincere Zoroastrians came forward to participate in this project. They were Firoj Panthaky, retired conservator of

plantations, and Farrokh Kasad, a man with a green thumb, having vast knowledge of agriculture and himself a very experienced and successful farmer. There were a few other good people we had inducted as Trustees. but the two fulcrums around which our work began were Firoj & Farrokh. Sadly, Firoj has passed on, but happily Farrokh continues to remain very actively and deeply involved in our work.

We began our project with a donation of £ 1,000 received from London to help the family of a gentleman called Hormusji Avari who resided in the village of Khambhla. Since that time, we have not looked back, on account of the support that the WZO Trusts have been receiving from donors, all over the world.

Starting in an extremely modest manner, over the years the WZO Trusts have evolved into fairly large entities. involved in multiple welfare activities. In any and every area of Community need, WZO Trusts have been present making their mark.

Delaveen: Who do you attribute the success of WZO Trusts to?

Mr. Tamboly: Naturally to our donors without whose support we could not have achieved anything. Our donors are satisfied because we deliver on projects

undertaken with their funds, displaying complete transparency, resulting in they being confident that their funds have been put to optimum use and for which they continue to support us with repeated donations. Our main donors do not believe in giving large donations towards corpus, for they rightly believe that would make the Trustees complacent. They prefer to witness their largesse being optimally utilised. That is the reason why we, even today have very modest corpus but have been able to undertake large projects and execute them to the full satisfaction of our donors.

Delaveen: How do the beneficiaries of WZO Trust react to the help you provide?

Mr. Tamboly: Our beneficiaries are happy because we believe in the principle that the dignity of every human being is inviolable. We speak to our beneficiaries in the same voice as we do with our donors. What has been
