WZO Trust Funds

Farmer's Rehabilitation Project

Since 1991, we have been involved in the rehabilitation of 484 farmers in 196 villages, expending Rs. 65,394,808. Average annual need amounts to Rs. 200,000 per beneficiary; we cater to around 15 beneficiaries every year.

Self-Employment Project

Since 1995, we have extended interest free financial support to 1038 Zoroastrians across 114 locations, expending Rs. 176,057,043

We hope to benefit this financial year 50 individuals at a cost of Rs. 250,000 per person.

Educational Support & Youth Activities

Number of students benefitted from education support in 2016-2017: 135 We expect to assist 150 students at an average cost of Rs. 65,000 per student during this financial year.

Support to Mobeds

We jointly run with Athornan Mandal the Mobed
Welfare Scheme that supports 67 young full time
Mobeds by way of financial incentives.
We have raised and capitalized Rs. 16,000,000
for this scheme, the interest of
which is utilized for the disbursements.

Senior Citizens Centres at Navsari

We have established two centres for Senior
Citizens at Navsari, which is a much sought
after facility where 55 senior citizens
reside in a very vibrant atmosphere.

Average monthly cost is Rs. 9,000 per resident.

Rural Housing Project

Over the years, we have replaced 256 huts into cottages made from brick and mortar. Present cost incurred for each replacement is Rs. 500,000.

Relief from Poverty

Every year we raise funds to extend lump sum financial support to around 350 families.

Additionally, we also support another 400 families by way of quarterly remittances of Rs. 3000 per month.

Medical Support

363 individuals benefitted from Medical Support in the last financial year at a total cost of Rs. 21,710,166.

We expect to cater to around the same number of individuals during the current year.

Economy Housing at Navsari

We receive old dilapidated houses as gifts, which we demolish and construct as apartment buildings that are given out on very modest license fees to poor Zororastrians. We have so far constructed 14 such apartment buildings.

Sanjan Sanatorium


Open to Zoroastrians from all walks of life

Highlights of some of our key programs...


Farmer's Rehabilitation Project

Agriculture is a key source of livelihood for a majority of our Zoroastrian brothers and sisters living in the remote villages of Gujarat.

However, lack of tools and unpredictable weather make even basic sustenance difficult. Through our Farmer's Rehabilitation Project we offer the machinery and the labour assistance farmers may need to run their farming without any roadblocks.

These include:

- Drilling borewells and purchasing pump sets so they're not dependent on monsoons alone for their crops.
- → Setting up poultry and dairy farms, establishing brick kilns to support their agricultural income and increase sustenance value. Providing tractors and mini-tractors to make farming more efficient.
- → Laying pipelines to ensure equitable water distribution throughout the field.





For those from the community with entrepreneurial ambitions but lack of capital to pursue them, our Self Employment Project offers interest-free loans as well as the necessary mentorship. We've set up a multitude of opportunities, so that no one with a particular skillset is excluded.

These include:



- → Play groups for children
- Catering and tiffin supply
- Running of canteens
- → Autorickshaws
- Commercial taxis and trucks
- → Mobile phone shops
- Saris and gara embroidery
- → Motor garages
- Service station for vehicles
- Pharmaceutical shops and distributorships
- Computer jobs
- → Painting and Photography
- Cold storage and General Stores
- Tuition classes and many more...



Rural Housing

Extreme poverty has made even the basic necessity of shelter a struggle to fulfill. Many live in flimsy shanties that hardly stand up to the challenges of extreme weather, wild animals, infections, etc. Our Rural Housing Program alleviates these families from such dire circumstances by transforming their huts into sturdy cottages.

Each of these houses presently cost Rs. 5,00,000 to build.

We have a long way to go with an estimated 500+ huts still to replace.

Relief from Poverty

Although many find it hard to digest the idea of poverty in the Parsi community, it does not change the fact that a section of the community lives in extreme struggle. We help these families by providing support in the form of lumpsum financial aid. In addition, we provide food grains and other essentials to 200 families every year; we also support over 400 families by way of quarterly disbursement.

Senior Citizens Centre

Our Bai Maneckbai P.B. Jeejeebhoy Senior
Citizens Centre and Dolat & Hormusji
Vandrewala Senior Citizens Centre offer a peaceful
abode for senior citizens, where they live
independently with self-respect and dignity.
We provide quality services and activities that
keep the centre's residents active, healthy and
happy.





Low Economy Housing

Thanks to the benovelence of many of the residents in Navsari who gift us their ancestral houses, we can provide affordable housing to Parsis from low-economic groups. Under the Low Economy Housing Program, we demolish the old structures, raise funds and construct new buildings at affordable license fees.

Bai Maneckbai P.B. Jeejeebhoy Sanatorium

Hidden away from urban chaos, and located in the historically rich land of Sanjan, this sanatorium is a palatial bungalow housing comfortable rooms, sprawling gardens, idyllic orchards and more – all available to the community at an extremely reasonable rate (Rs.550/day for full boarding & lodging). Also standing tall and proud on the property adjoining to ours is the Sanjan memorial column.

Self-Employment Project

Higher farming output means higher distribution. Farmers sell their agricultural and poultry yield to self-employed entrepreneurs like poultry shop owners.



Poverty Relief and Employment Opportunities

Senior Citizens Centre, in its turn, employs cooks and helpers from economically backward and poverty stricken homes to help with the catering and other activities in the centre.
